Professional Licenses

Q: Will any arrangements be made for people with state licensure that need to recertify during this Crisis? For instance, a paramedic whose license is expiring in May or June?

A: For licensees regulated by the Illinois Department of Financial and Professional Regulation (IDFPR), the agency has issued variances/guidance to allow all current licensees that have renewal deadlines on March 1, 2020 through July 31, 2020 to be extended until September 30, 2020. The variances/guidance can be found here.

EMT licenses are regulated by the Department of Public Health (IDPH) and the renewal deadline has been delayed to June 30, 2020.

Higher Education

Q: If my school moves classes online, am I going to get less financial aid?

A: Students receive financial aid from various sources. They should reach out to each institution that they receive financial aid from to understand the circumstances associated with each source of assistance. The Illinois Board of Higher Education has a <u>website</u> with links to public and private postsecondary institutions' COVID-19 websites. The Illinois Student Assistance Commission also created a <u>website</u> with financial aid tips for students affected by COVID-19. The U.S. Department of Education has also provided guidance in a FAQ document.

Park Districts

Q: Park Districts are looking for guidance for the summer in regard to activities at pools.

A: The state has not issued guidance regarding summer activities organized by park districts at this time. Executive Order 2020-10 and as extended by Executive Order 2020-18 can provide information on essential v. non-essential businesses. IDPH is participating in a webinar on April 30th with the Illinois Park District Association. They encourage all interested stakeholders to attend.

Business Assistance

Q: Which state business assistance programs are nonprofit organizations eligible for?

A: DCEO complied <u>a document</u> with information regarding emergency funding resources for businesses. This document includes information regarding eligibility, including nonprofit eligibility, and how business can apply. Nonprofits can also seek financial assistance through the <u>Illinois COVID-19 Response Fund</u>.
